


SOUND AND LIGHT IN CONTEMPORARY ART

Her work, which draws from cultural and social memory, uses a Minimalist language in its construction, providing the viewer with a direct and intimate interaction. Whispering Domes (2001) is constructed from sheetrock and two circular skylights.

The cylinders create a lowtech parabolic chamber, which enables viewers to amplify their voices architecturally.



Born 1968 in Port of Spain, Trinidad and Tobago Lives and works in New York

Olivier received her B.A. in psychology in 1989 from Dartmouth College in Hanover, New Hampshire, and her M.F.A. in 2001 from Cranbrook Academy of Art in Bloomfield Hills, Michigan.
